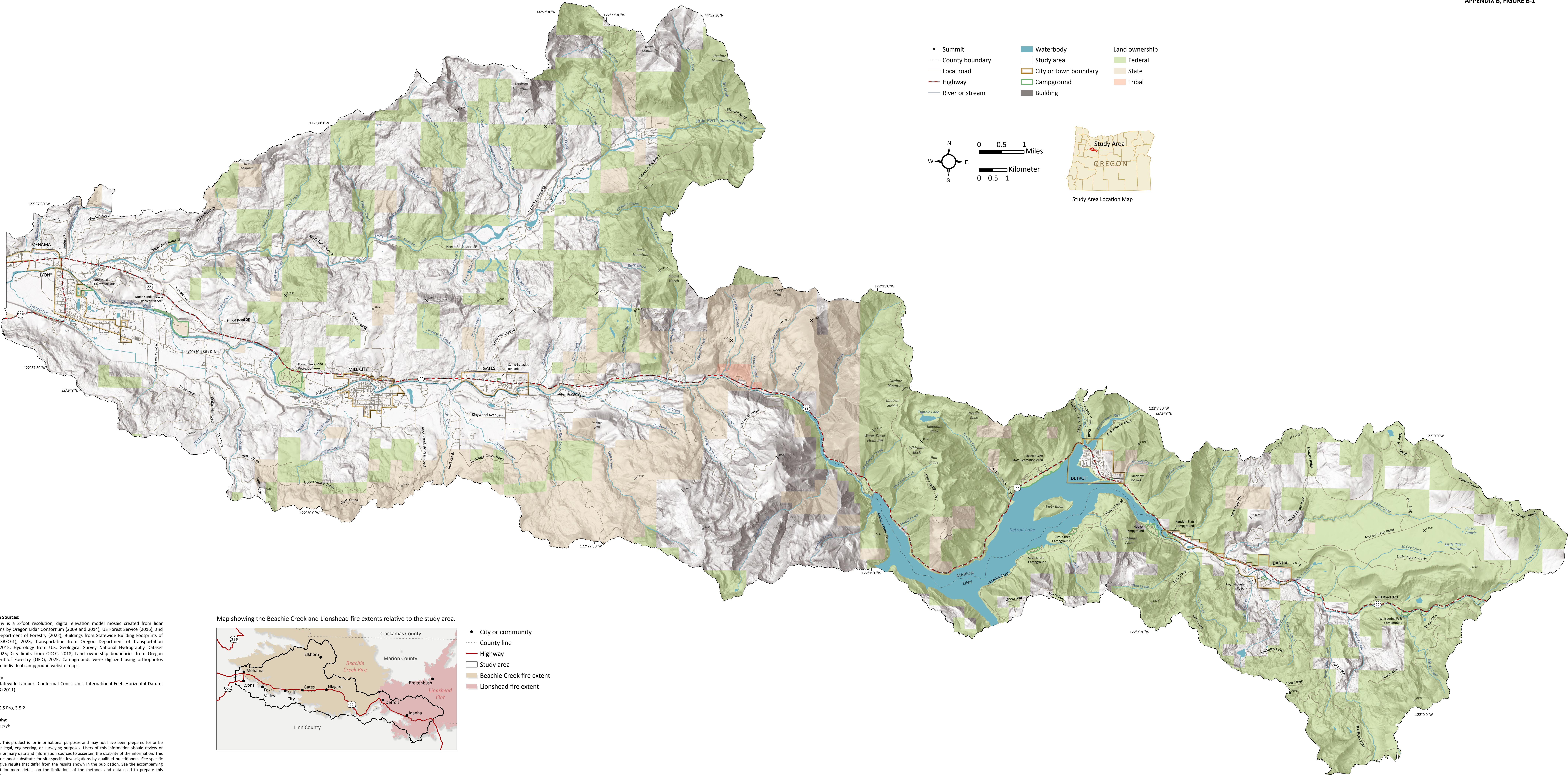

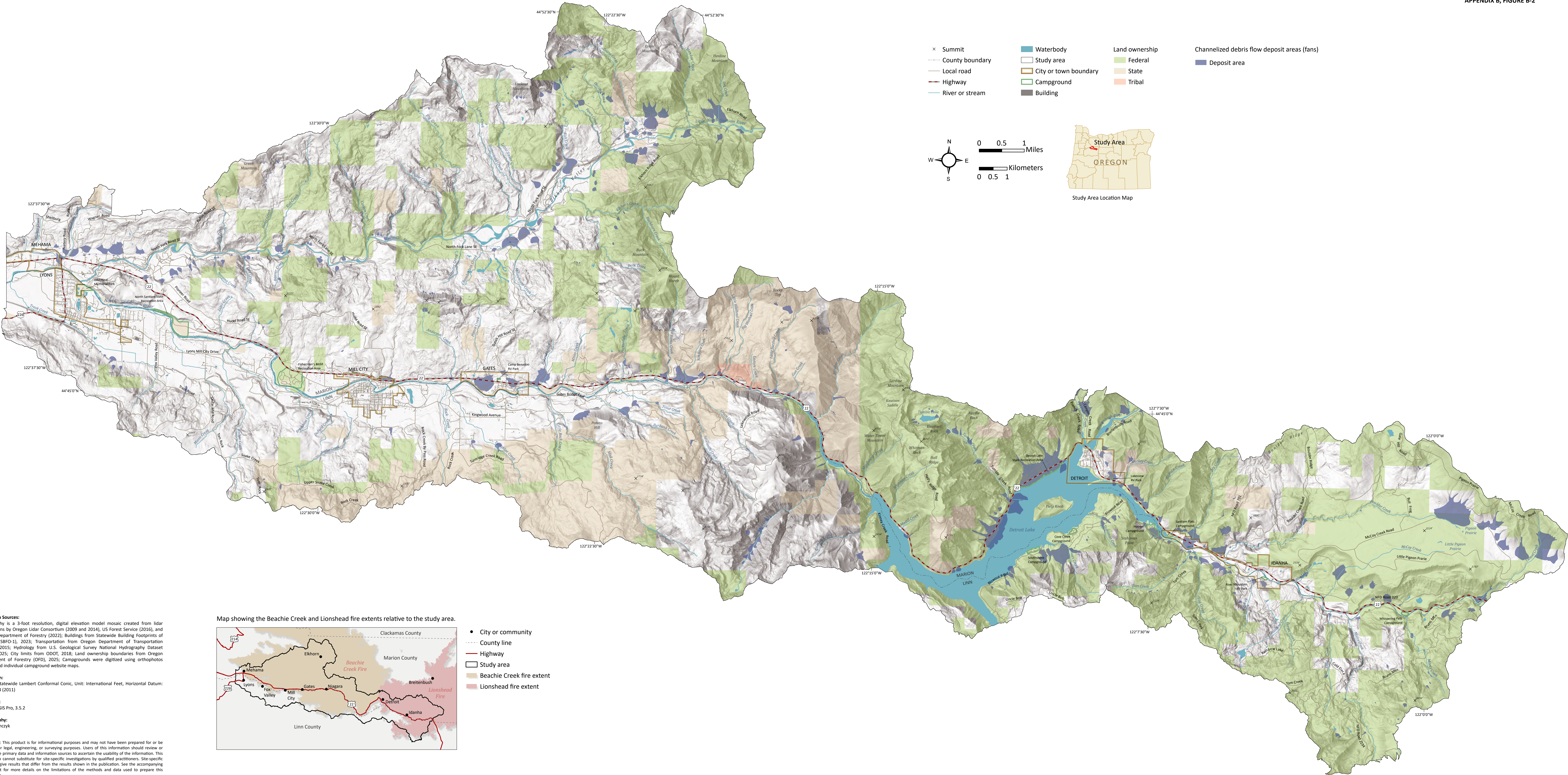

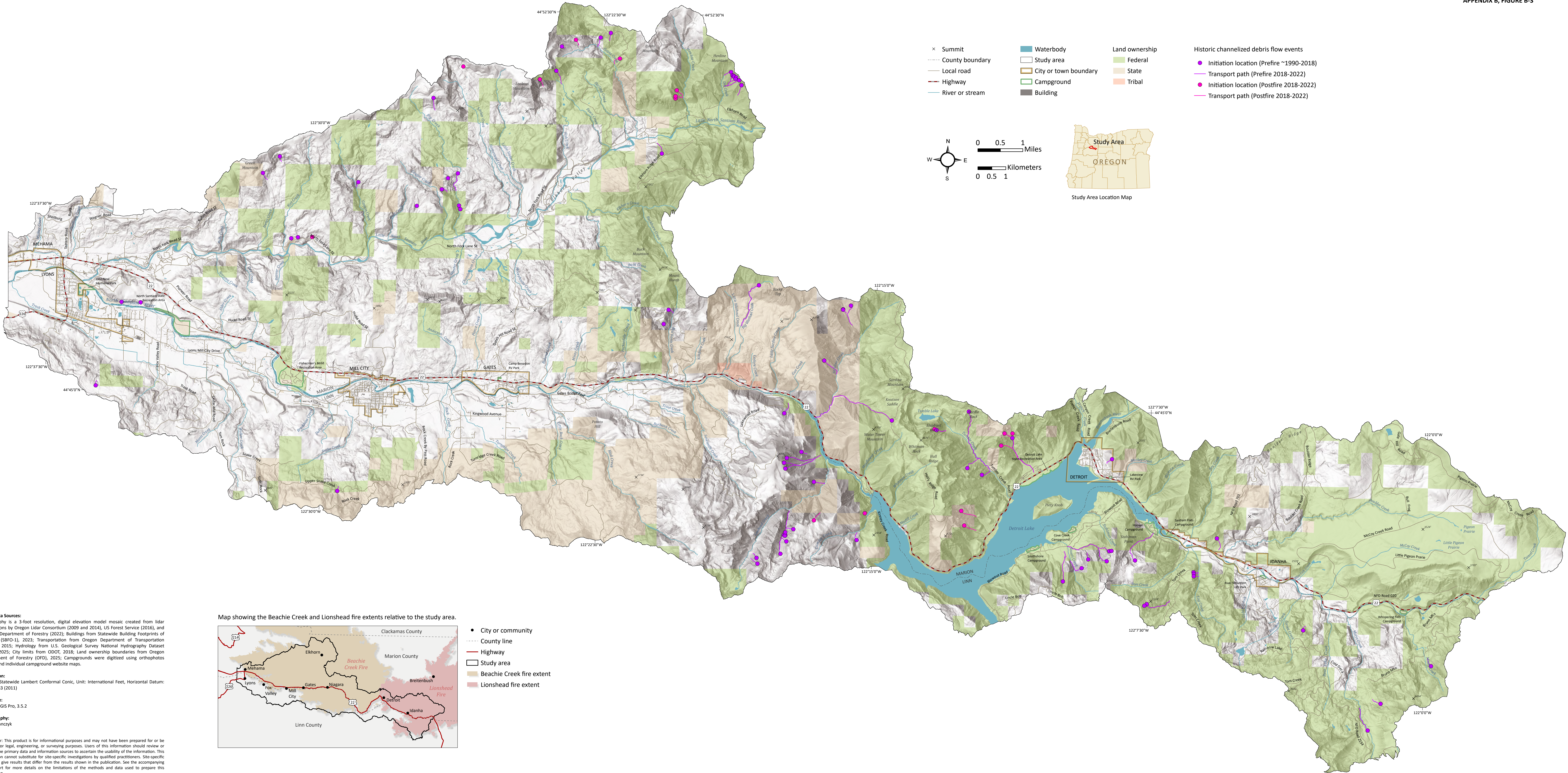
Map of Historic Channelized Debris Flow Events, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

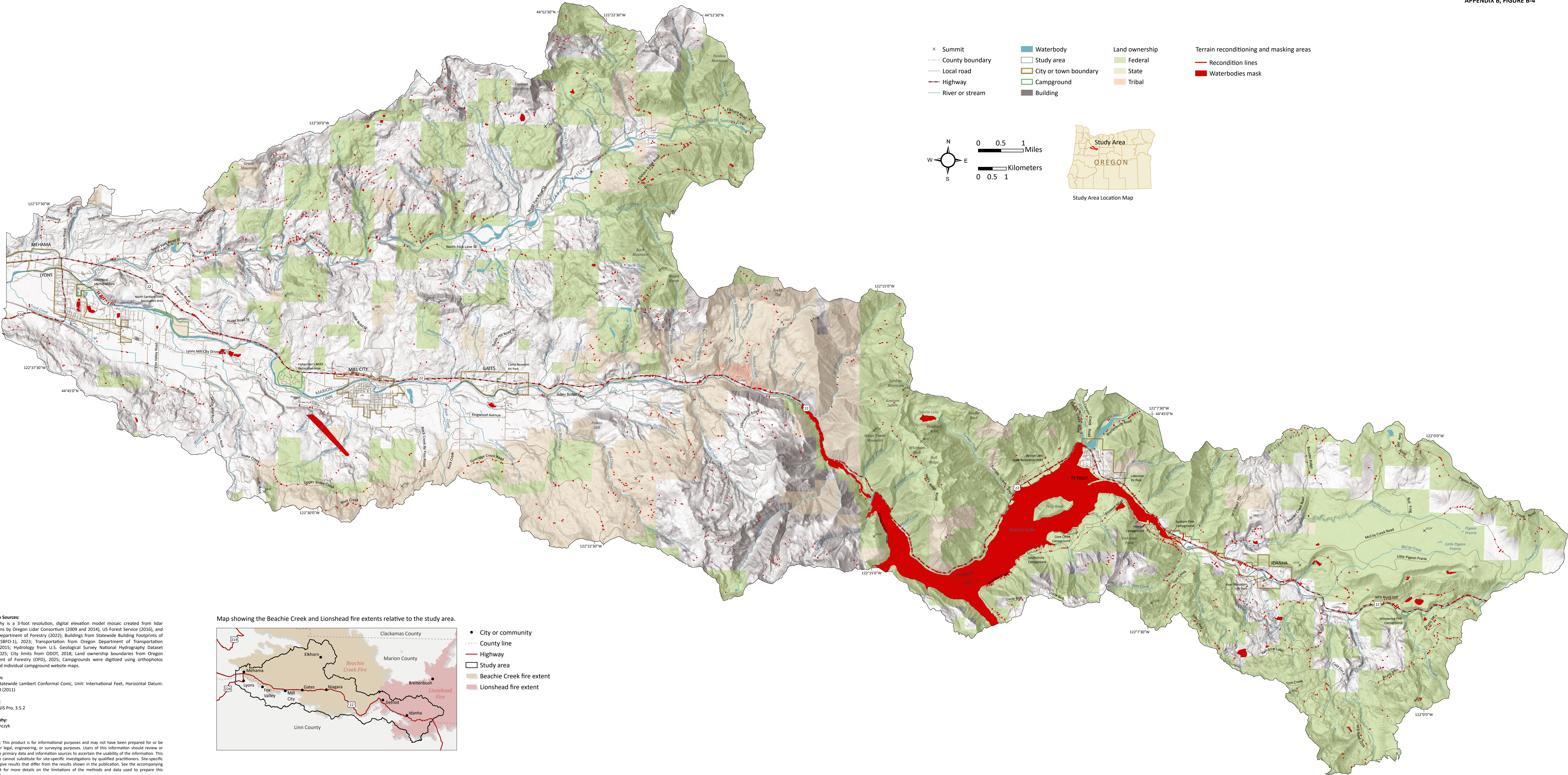
Map of Terrain Reconditioning and Masking Areas, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

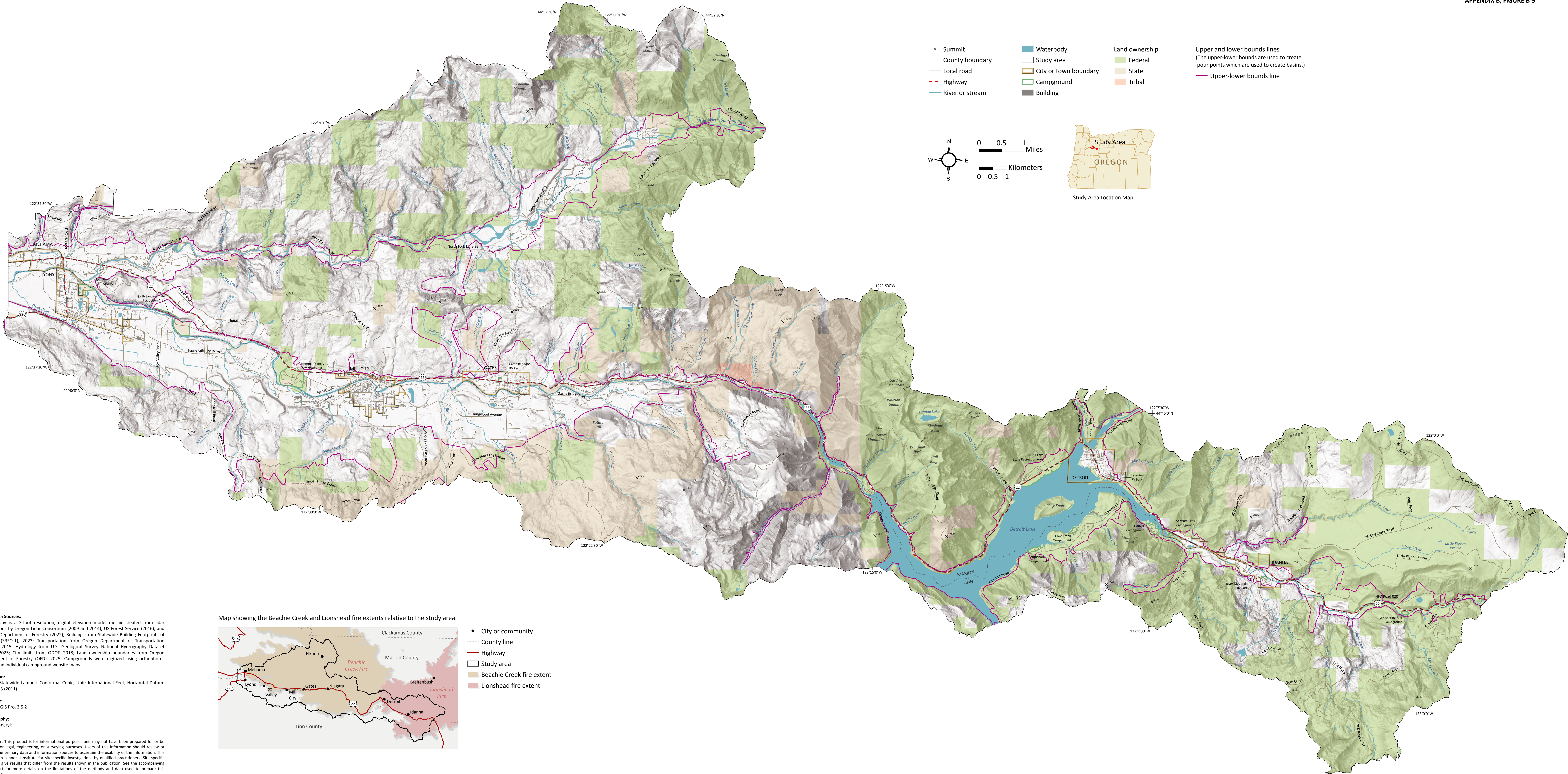
Map of the Upper-Lower Bounds, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

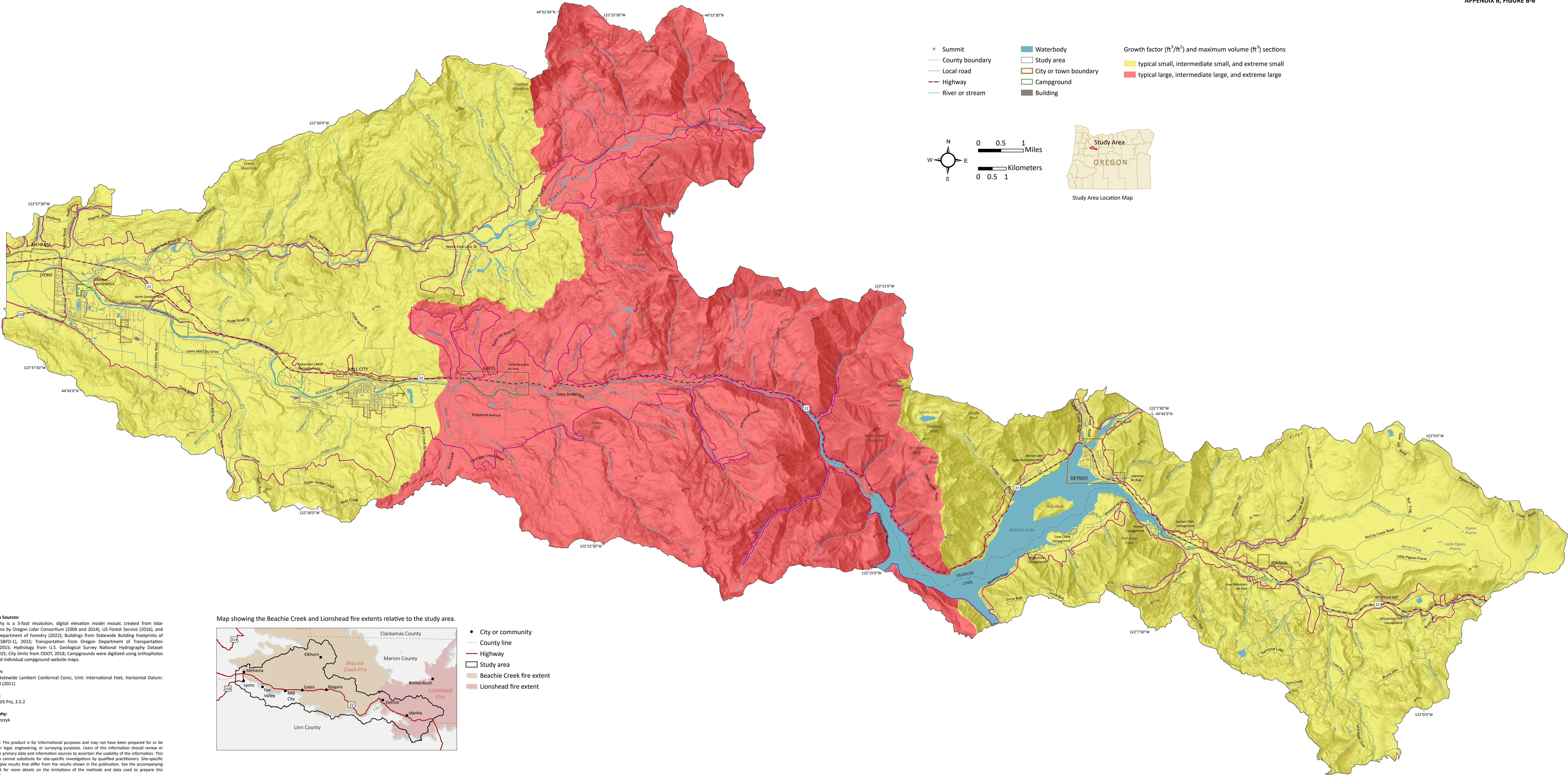

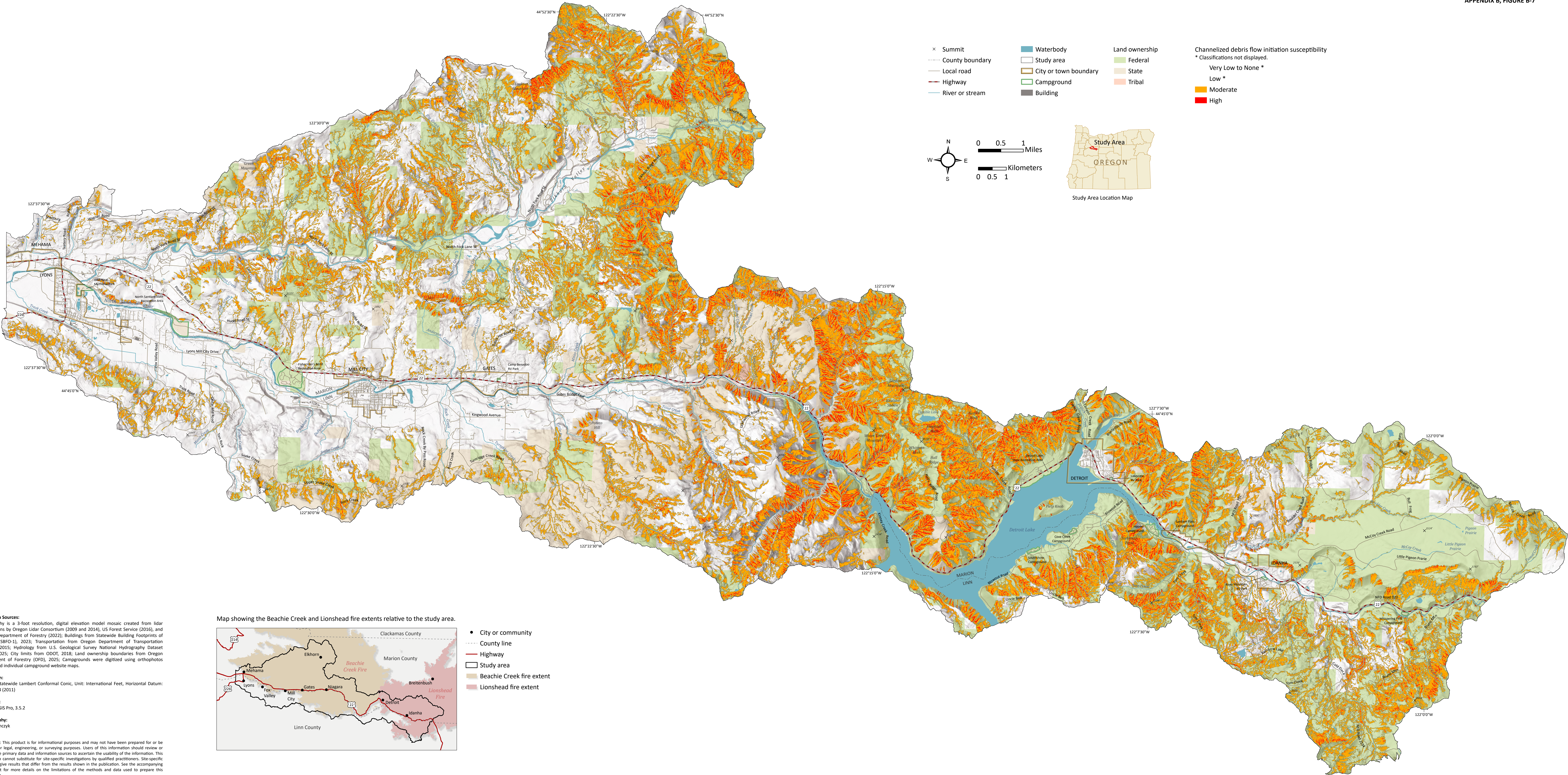
Map of Initiation Susceptibility, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

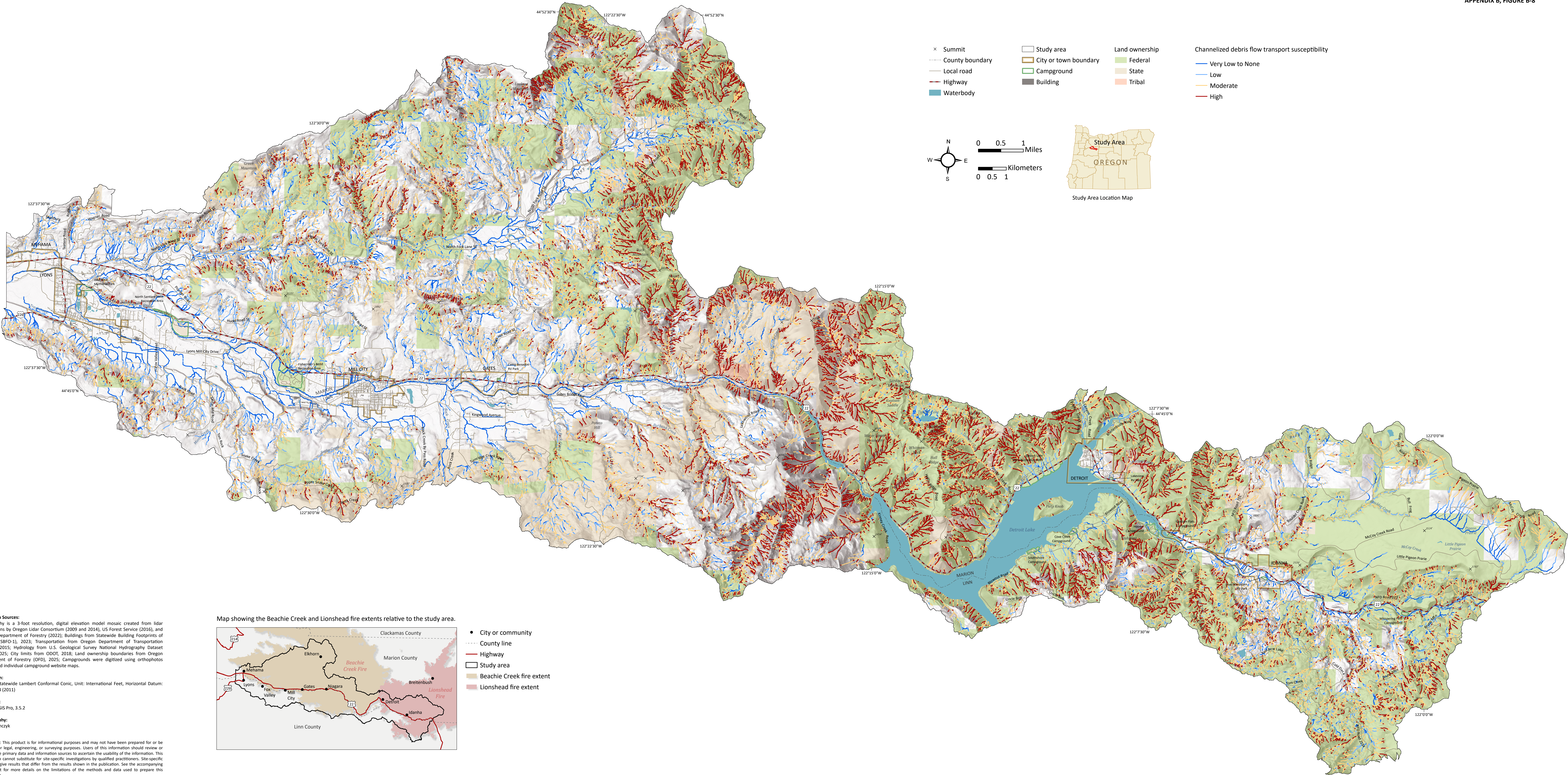
Map of Transport Susceptibility, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

Map showing the Beachie Creek and Lionshead fire extents relative to the study area.





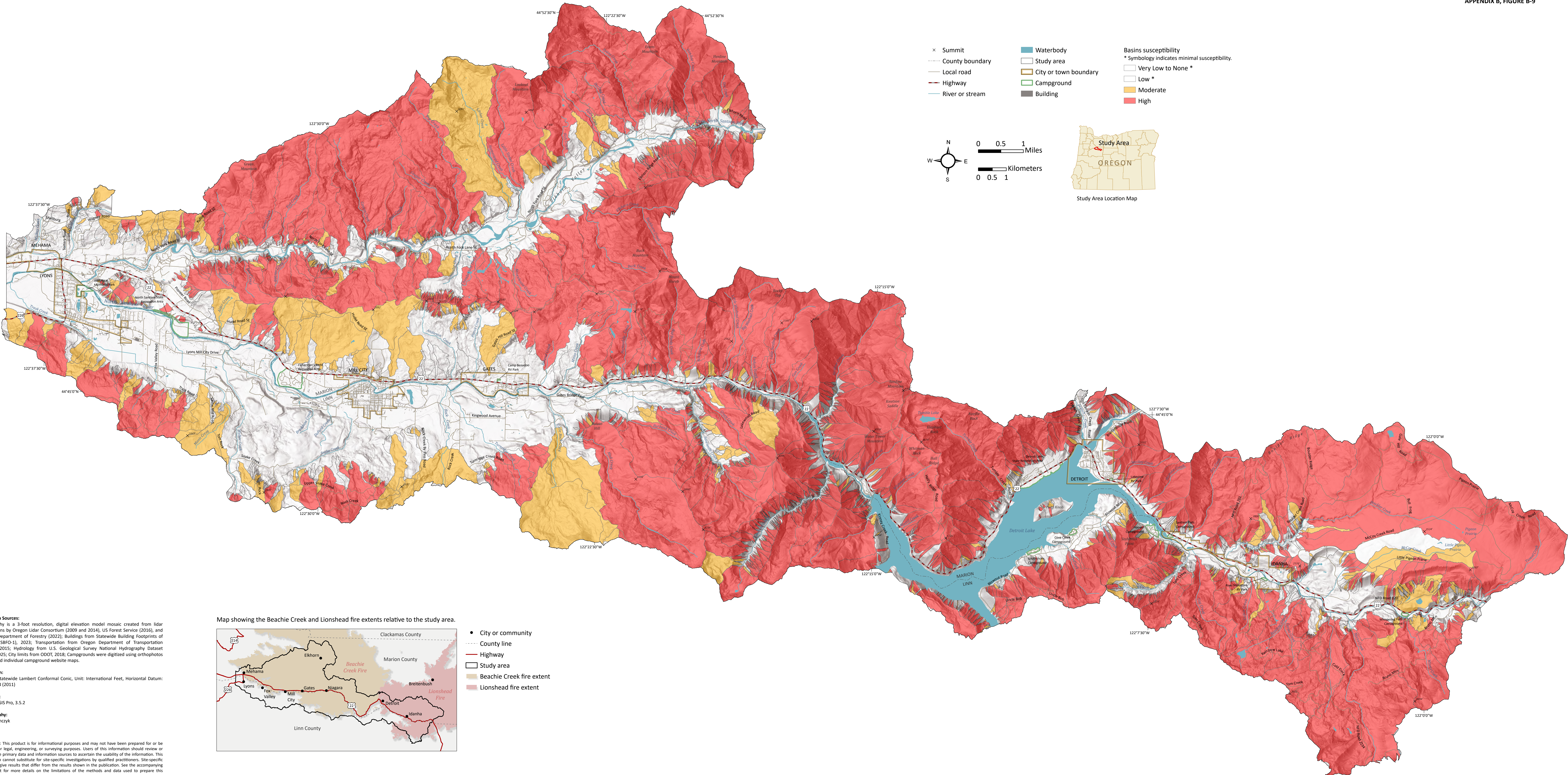
Map of Basin Susceptibility, Beachie Creek-Lionshead Fire Study Area, Marion and Linn Counties, Oregon

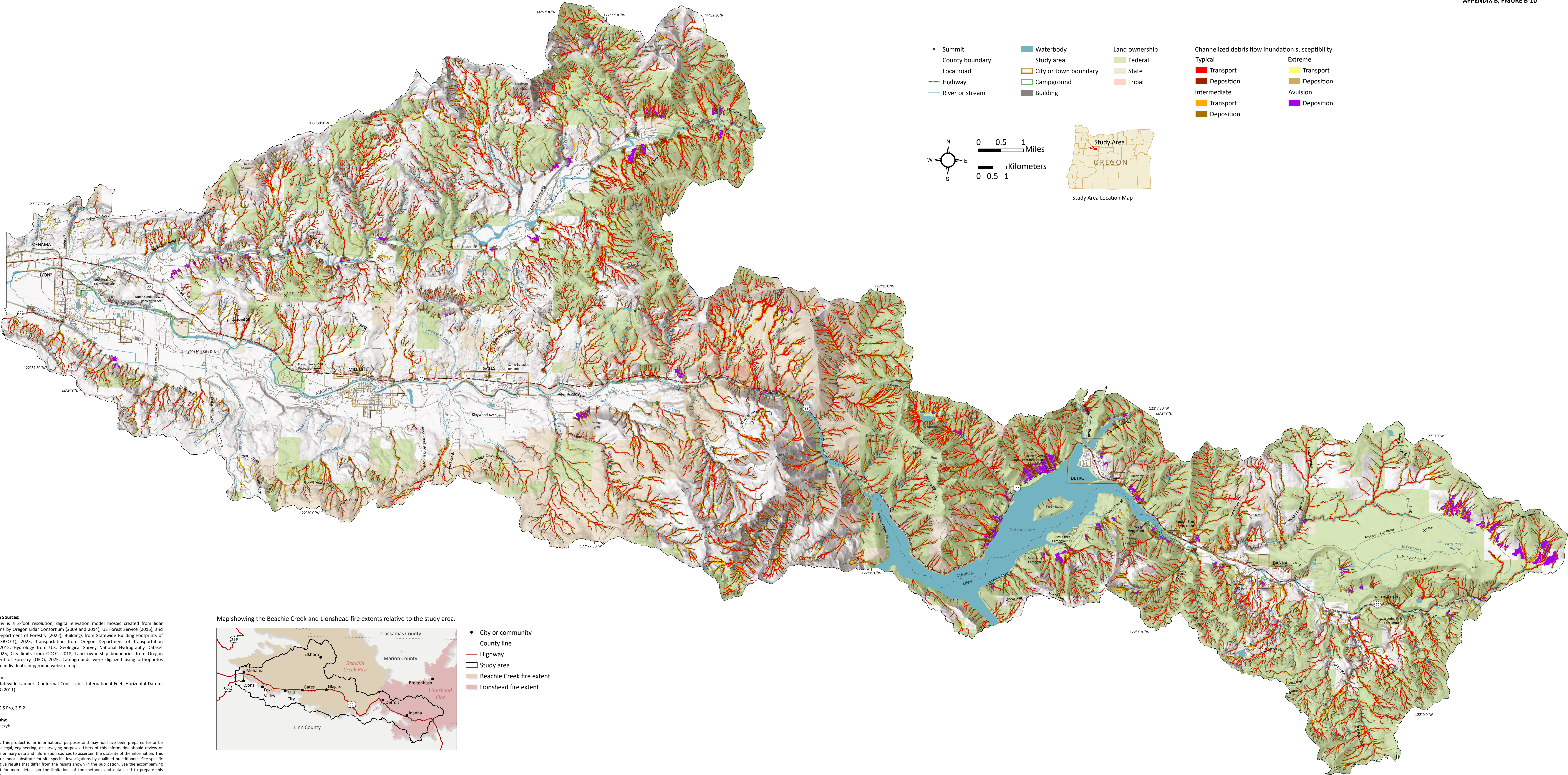
